Board Minutes

PVOA Board of Directors Meeting Unapproved Minutes March 8, 2023

President Michael Wright called the meeting to order at 7 pm. Board members in attendance: Chad Metcalf, Justin Norwood, Kurt Proctor, and Mike Wright. Absent: Brittany Bellows, Patrick Dodge, Josh Ong, Sean Stoube, and Randy Warm. Also in attendance: Ben Petty, head of maintenance. Deanna Nielsen. clerk, and one resident.

A quorum was not present so no action could be taken. The agenda was reviewed and a couple items were discussed.

An audit of the 2022 financial records is needed. Eric Engstrom is no longer able to complete the audit. Per the By-laws Article VIII Section 8d "an audit of the Association books to be made by a public accountant at the completion of each fiscal year." Ron Mathias who files the tax return, checked with his boss at Timmer & Assoc about doing an audit. A complete audit would be \$3000 and a review of the books would be \$1500 to \$2000. Only \$600 is budgeted for the audit. Board member decided to seek out a community member with an accounting degree to provide an audit for \$600.

Patrick sent a written report about the complaints he has reviewed. A homeowner in Dexter Acres that has a camper in the driveway was sent a letter. A resident that complained about sump pump drainage from their neighbor was encouraged to work out the issue with the neighbor but if not, civil action would be the next step. The county has sent a letter to the homeowner with multiple cars in disrepair. Some vehicles have been moved. The county will follow up.

Fireworks are set for Saturday, July 1st at dusk. Mike has contacted vendors.

Quad City United Way's Spring Day of Caring is May 18th. Ben suggested painting the tunnel in 2nd addition and pavilion (ceiling) at Meadowbrook. Deanna will work on the application.

Ben has a presentation about labor hours ready for viewing. He will present it at next month's meeting.

Mike asked the resident if he had comments for the board. He shared a concern of water shut off knobs protruding above the sidewalks in Dexter Acres causing a tripping hazard. Board members asked him to take the concern to the Park View Water Company. Another topic he brought to the board was to increase revenue by other means than a dues increase. Lots of ideas were discussed such as a family could sponsor a parkway and have a sign put up, charge a fee for using the yard waste area, rent parking spots on the hard service by the shop, make a RV/camper storage area, have paid ads in the Profile to cover the cost of mailing, etc. Mike relayed that the lawyer would have to be contacted to see if any of the ideas would be possible for PVOA.

Meeting adjourned at 7:45 pm. The next monthly business meeting is April 12 at 7 pm.


